Ad Hoc Non-Allocable Budget Review Process Spring 2011

We support the principals of shared governance and the rights of the students to be active participants in issues of student life as outlined by Wisconsin State Statute 36.09(5).

As the discussions regarding proposed changes to the student governance structure at UWSP have not yet completed, the current student governance structure remains as stated in the 2009 document, "Student Involvement in Allocable and Non-Allocable Decision Making at UW-Stevens Point." The five student governance groups retain their rights of oversight of the non-allocable fees outlined in the document until such time as the agreed upon procedures are changed and filed with the UW System President's designee described in University of Wisconsin System Regent Policy Document 30-5(c).


In order to review and submit the allocable and non-allocable budgets to UW System by the April 15 deadline, the five student governance groups agree to the following process for the Spring 2011 semester:

1. UCAPB and SHAC send budgets to John Birrenkott by February 28, 2011.
2. John Birrenkott sends budgets to Chancellor Patterson.
3. Chancellor Patterson sends UCAPB and SHAC budget to SGA Finance Committee for meaningful review by March 2, 2011. NOTE: The SGA Finance Committee is the structure that was in place at the beginning of the 2010-2011 academic year.
4. SGA reviews budgets as outlined by their procedures that were in place under the 2009 student shared governance agreement.
5. All allocable and non-allocable budgets are sent to Chancellor Patterson by March 18, 2011
6. Chancellor Patterson reviews budgets and submits to UW System the allocable and non-allocable fee proposal by April 1, 2011 and the full budget detail by April 15, 2011.


